## 2025 Summer EBT SUN BUCKS Parent Information letter

## Dear Parent/Guardian:

The propose of this Letter is to announce the availability of Electronic Benefit Transfer (EBT) for 2025 Summer call EBT SUN Bucks the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) has approved the Arizona Department of Economic Security (DES) to administer EBT Sun Bucks in partnership with Arizona Department of Education (ADE). Students meeting the eligibility requirements will qualify to receive the 2025 Summer EBT SUN BUCKS benefit of \$120 starting the week of May 5, 2025.

To be eligible for Sun Bucks Summer EBT, Students had to be enrolled SY 2024-2025 in a participating National School Lunch Program (NSLP) site and determined eligible for free or reduced-price meal benefits during this School Year 2024-2025 at sites that participated in Special Provision Option (SPO) Provision 2, Provision 3, or Community Eligibility Provisions(CEP) in SY 2024-2025 automatically qualify for 2025 Summer EBT Sun Bucks.

To ensure the information being provided to DES is current, please make sure that you update your student information (such as current address, parent/guardian, phone number, etc.) at your child's school. The Richard B. Russell National School Lunch Act requires the information requested in order to verify your children's eligibility for free or reduced-price meals. If you do not provide the information or provide incomplete information, your children may no longer receive free or reduced-price meals.
