- Do not send or allow your student to come to school sick. We are still following COVID-19 protocols and if your student is sick, we will isolate them and call you to pick them up and take them to see a doctor and get tested. Please help our school community stay healthy!
- Seniors need to check with counselors on your progress toward GRADUATION! As the year moves closer to graduation, you need to make sure you have met all the requirements. The counselors send important information like the ACT testing, Scholarship applications, college and military visits, FAFSA, etc., to your Hornetland Email accounts. Please check often. 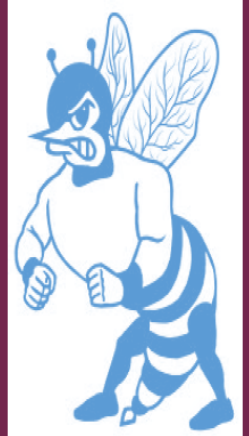
