
Please make sure you are calling in for attendance on the days your child is not scheduled (A/B days).



Bus Students, Parents and Guardians: For the safety and security of our students, we would like to take this time

to remind students, parents, or anyone responsible for picking up or dropping off students of the district procedures and policy for the use of designated bs stops. We cannot allow students to get on or off of the bus in areas that are not designated bus stops. This leads to confusion and can be a real safety issue. SCHOOL BUS SAFETY TIPS:

- When waiting for the bus, stay away from traffic and avoid roughhousing or other behavior that can lead to carelessness
- Wait until the bus has stopped and the door opens before stepping onto the roadway.
- When on the bus, find a seat and sit down. Never put head, arms, or hands out of the window
- O When exiting if you have to cross the street in front of the bus, walk at least 10 feet ahead of the bus along the side until you can turn around and see the driver. Make sure that the driver can see you.
- Stay away from the bus's rear at all times.
